Overview

This course provides delegates with the knowledge and skills required to virtualize most apps with Cloudpaging Studio 9. Delegates will build on their existing packaging skills with best practice approaches, and learn how to troubleshoot common issues in the creation of virtualized appsets.

This course also teaches delegates how to take advantage of advanced features of Cloudpaging Studio, to deliver more compatible and better performing appsets. App Events, patching, prefetching and local paging are all covered on this course.

Audience profile

This course is for Information Technology professionals who use Cloudpaging Studio to package apps into virtual appsets. Additionally, this course builds skills for third and fourth line engineers who support Windows desktop and BYOD.

- Basic scripting experience
- Understanding of Windows client operating system essentials (such as Windows 7, 8 or 10)
